BIRD to invest \$8 million in 10 new projects

The approved projects involve innovations in the areas of healthcare & wellness, advanced materials, manufacturing technologies, water and others.

June 29, 2015 – During its meeting on June 18, 2015, held in Washington D.C., the Board of Governors of the Israel-U.S. Binational Industrial Research and Development (BIRD) Foundation approved \$8 million in funding for ten new projects between U.S. and Israeli companies. In addition to the grants from BIRD, the projects will access private sector funding, boosting the total value of all projects to approximately \$19 million.

Digital Healthcare Delegation to the U.S.

From May 18 - May 22, 2015, a delegation of a dozen Israeli Digital Healthcare companies came to the U.S. to meet with major industry stakeholders to explore business opportunities, demonstration pilots and collaborations. The delegation included the following companies:

Consumer Physics, Healarium, HealthWatch Technologies, Kyma Medica, LifeonKey, medCPU, Medisafe Project, Medivizor, Sweetch, Telesofia, Totally and Tyto Care.

The delegation was led and organized by the BIRD Foundation and the Ministry of Economy led by the Israel Economic Mission in New York and San Francisco, and in cooperation with the New England Israel Business Council.

The visit to NY, Boston & San Francisco offered a unique opportunity for the companies to present their technologies to leading hospitals and have pre-arranged meetings with companies such as Khosla Ventures, Samsung Strategy & Innovation Center, Google Ventures and McKesson. In addition, the Israeli companies met with hospitals such as NYU Langone Hospital, Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston, Stanford Hospital & UCSF Hospital in San Francisco.

Spotlight on a BIRD Grantee



American Water Applies Innovative Technologies from Israel to its U.S. Operations

With the recent approval of its third BIRD project, American Water continues to bring innovative technologies from Israeli industry and apply them to its water/wastewater operations in the U.S. Israeli ideas in the water industry offer promise, given the country's ability to get full value from its limited sources of potable water using demonstrated skills in desalination operations, conservation and water reuse technologies. Since 2012, American Water and its Israeli partners have received BIRD awards on three projects totaling over 2.5 million dollars.

The first project with **Steam Control Inc** ., started in April 2013, is now nearing completion. The technology involves a product called Aqua Guard, a device that can modify the typically fixed downstream pressure of pressure reducing valves (PRV). Two other projects for which American Water has been approved for funding include **IOSight** and **WellToDo** . In the project with IOSight, American Water is helping to develop analytical tools to help identify data trends in water and wastewater treatment plants and allow plant operators to respond to these trends, thereby improving operational efficiencies. The project started in April 2015 and will continue for two years. In its newest project with WellToDo, an innovative nitrate removal system will be commercialized. This two-year project is scheduled to begin in October 2015. [Click here for the full article](#)
