The social health web is currently estimated at 10 Billion unique patient records, and is expected to grow at a pace of 40%-50% annually. "Up until now, there was no real way to utilize this untapped pool of collective knowledge, explains Mantel. "Treato™ is taking this vibrant, nearly infinite space filled with potentially life-changing insights - and putting it at your fingertips.

By enabling instant access to real-life patient experiences with every listed FDA drug, prescribed or OTC, patients can better understand what it means to cope with their medical condition, as well as the effectiveness and side effects of their drugs. In addition, the
